Annual Report 2019

We received 123 applications for the Awards 2019.

After ample discussion the National Selection Committee selected eight nominees from these applicants. You'll find them listed below with their country and target species:

- Divya Karnad (India) working on sharks and Olive Ridley sea turtles
- Fernanda Abra (Brazil) protecting canids, felids and tapir
- Hugh Doulton (United Kingdom) working in the Comoros to protect Livingstone's fruit bats
- Iroro Tanshi (Nigeria) working on the protection of the Short-tailed roundleaf bat
- Jessa B. Garibay (Philippines) protecting Palawan horned frogs
- Olivier Nsengimana (Rwanda) conserving Grey Crowned Cranes
- Sonam Lama (Nepal) working to protect the red panda
- Tjalle Boorsma (the Netherlands) working in Bolivia for the conservation of the Blue-throated Macaw

After a thorough assessment by the members of the International Selection Committee the Board assigned the three Award winners 2019: **Fernanda Abra, Divya Karnad, and Olivier Nsengimana**. They all came to Arnhem to receive the award and 50.000 euro prize money.

We were honoured to have [Russell A. Mittermeier](#) as our Guest of Honour. For the winners, it was an incredible opportunity to interact with such a legend! Mittermeier is a primatologist and herpetologist, a conservation leader in the field of biodiversity and tropical forest, named a 'hero for the planet' by Times Magazine. Furthermore, he is the author of 40 books.



Future For Nature winner 2016 [Wietse van der Werf](#) (the Netherlands) gave an uplifting update on his journey after winning the award. He founded the Sea Ranger Service, where unemployed youth are trained by navy veterans to patrol protected sea areas. This concept is so successful, that Wietse closed government deals in the Netherlands, is talking with governments of other countries such as the United Kingdom and Indonesia, and is working to create an alliance with the UN!

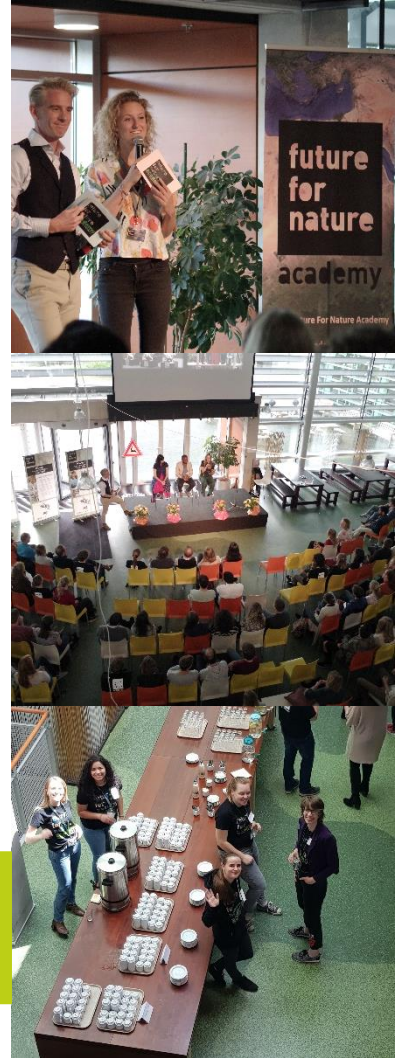

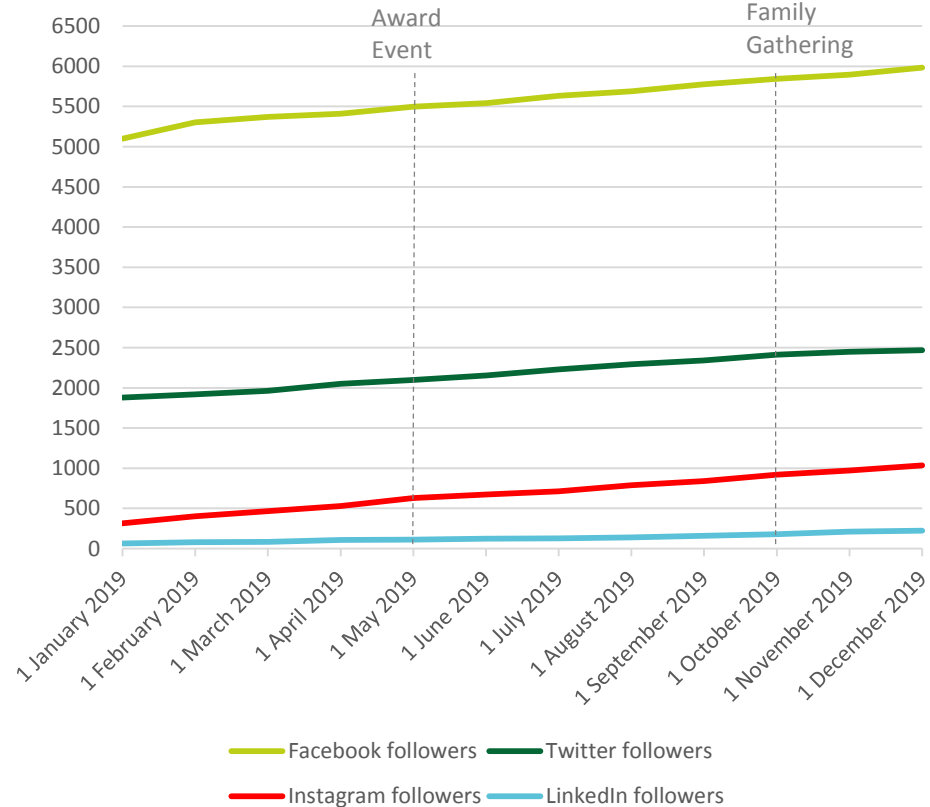

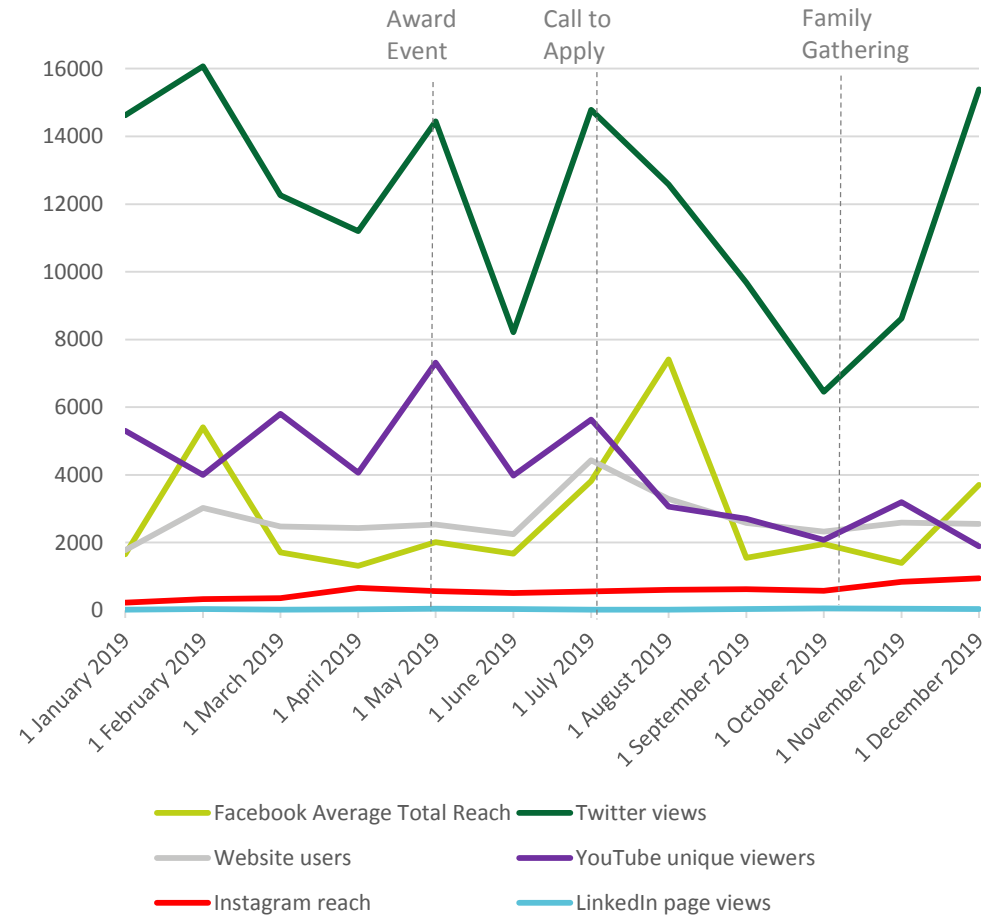
